
BECOME MASKTROTTER!

BEFORE YOU GO

START AN IMPROMPTU WORKSHOP

- Introduce yourself to random people and try to know if they feel aware of climate change process.. Ask them if they have already experienced the effects of climate change and/or pollution
- If you have a good feeling, ask them if they want to talk about it through art
- Create a mask with them: give the mask a name and ask him to write a few words about its signification

It is the best way to get rid of your waste, or to highlight your work after a good cleaning trek !






Transform waste into art, and discover the strenght of the Circular economy !
